Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Love is here to stay

Forever is a long time. Ask the couple who promises fidelity for only one lifetime! Or the celibate who takes vows for the long haul. Or the parents of a child who will occupy their concerns for the next 18 years and more.

Forever, if we can believe it, is even longer than that. Forever is longer than our mortgage; longer than our car and student loan payments laid end on end. Forever is longer than any physical pain we may be suffering and deeper than any misery we must bear.

Think of eternity as a pool of joy that we can never swim the length of. Eternity is well-being and strength, vigor and beauty, love and happiness that cannot die. If you want it to be, that is. If you prepare for everlasting love, you can have it. Even hell may not last as long as eternal joy, if the rabbis are right. In the Targums—interpretive translations of the Hebrew Bible—the sages wrote that the torments of hell would only last until the righteous took pity on the guilty.

Catechisms do not teach that of course. But it is an intriguing idea: that the punishment of the guilty might be determined by the volume of resentment of those whom they have wronged. Did not Jesus say that those whose sins are held would be bound, and those who are loosed would be freed? Scripture also says love is as fierce as death, and passion as mighty as hell. Oh, but that was just an Old Testament love song—but is it not also the Paschal Mystery?

The story of salvation history is all about forever: about God's promises which, like everything else about God, have no boundaries or expiration dates. Today, Moses tells the people about a forever lease on the land of promise. Saint Paul writes about an inheritance in Christ that means glory unending. In the gospel Jesus gives his word to his still weak and doubtful followers that, even though he is leaving them, he will be present to them always. Even though seasons end, Moses disappears, Paul is martyred, and Jesus ascends into heaven, the eternal things remain true, and—the best part—nothing is lost. Goodness has no end because God is good and God has no end. We celebrate our annual God-feast of the Trinity because, hurray, God should have one day on the liturgical calendar, do we not think? Along with all those saints and angels and Mary days and Jesus' days one feast cannot begin to honor the God who is time itself, and timeless as well. God is honored through all these other observances every day of the year.

But on this one Solemnity we remember that most deliberately. And we are reminded of the sweetness of a love that keeps us in mind, this day, and every day. [Alice Camille]



Supreme Council News Stepping Out in Faith

Thousands of Knights and their families participate in the historic National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

New Haven, Connecticut

"I had the honor of attending overnight adoration May 19 at St. Mary's, the starting point of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage's Seton Route. It happened to be my birthday, and I figured there was no better way to kick off the age of 44 than being in the presence of our Lord.

"I arrived at 1:45 a.m., and by 3 a.m. I could see and hear the other adorers start to move around. I thought that perhaps they too were starting to get a little restless. At around 3:45, this restless feeling of mine was suddenly replaced by an incredible sense of calm. The subsequent quietness of the others convinced me they felt it as well.





"Coming on the heels of two rather turbulent years in my life, this moment felt like a message from God: 'As long as you are in the presence of the Lord, you will have peace.' It was something I believe I was meant to experience and something I will never forget. Through this national pilgrimage, Christ is showing us that we can experience his presence in the Eucharist on a more intimate level than we ever anticipated."

"From the start of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton's conversion, the mystery of the Eucharist, the true presence of Christ's body and blood, had what I might call a gravitational pull on her heart, and mind and spirit.

"Elizabeth, as a devout young woman worshiping in her own congregation, it is said, heard bells sounding from a nearby Catholic Church as holy Mass was being celebrated. The ringing of the bells first alerted her sensitive, open heart to a Eucharistic faith that would become the foundation of her life. For when Elizabeth traveled to Livorno, Italy, with her husband, William, in the hope that he might recover from a serious illness, she encountered there a warm, full-fledged Eucharistic devotion.

"Returning to New York, Elizabeth underwent a time of anguished searching, especially as her family and friends tried to dissuade her from converting. Yet her desire for the Bread of Life became ever stronger. ... In 1805, she was received into the Catholic Church. She looked forward with happy anticipation to receiving the Holy Eucharist for the first time: 'At last,' she wrote, 'God is mine. And I am his.'

"As we trace the Seton Route along the East Coast, may you and I be overtaken by the same Eucharistic faith that animated St. Elizabeth Ann Seton."


